# american society for mass spectrometry

The American Society for Mass Spectrometry (ASMS) will sponser its annual conference:

Mass Spectrometry and Allied Topics Boston, Massachusetts May 8-13, 1983

This conference is the forum for Mass Spectrometry in the United States. Unfortunately the forensic community's participation at this meeting in the past has been minimal. The Society has a vested interest in seeing this participation increased and would welcome your contributions.

For those of you who have not had an opportunity to attend an ASMS meeting, the following will explain the meeting format. The meeting is divided into group sessions which are determined by intradisciplinary interests and one such group is the Forensic section. Topics that would be considered suitable for presentation include, among others, new quantitative and/or qualitative methodologies and spectral interpretations. Examples of some of the forensic presentations given at past meetings are:

PCP N-Oxide, a Potential Metabolite of Phencyclidine
GC/MS Analysis of N-Alkylated Barbiturates
Negative Ion Mass Spectrometry of Perfluoroacylated Opiates
Mass Spectrometry in Forensic Toxicology and Drug Analysis
Application of GC/MS to Problems in Forensic Drug Analysis
The Use of a Mobile Atmosphere Pressure Chemical Ionization Mass Spectrometer
in the Detection of Illicit Drugs

Although historically most presentations given have been from toxicologists and analytical drug chemists, other areas of forensic interest, such as explosives and arson, would also be welcome.

Program announcements will appear October 18th, 1982, and the deadline for abstract submission will be January 14th, 1983. Abstracts should be sent to:
